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Program Director Update

Tara's Chance joined forces with No Limits, a nonprofit day program for adults with special needs in Brea, in early 2023. Since then, this partnership has significantly contributed to the growth and development of over 40 adults with special needs who participate at Tara's Chance.



Every week, between six to ten students from No Limits visit Tara's Chance to engage in a variety of activities tailored to their individual interests. Some enjoy riding horses, others find joy in grooming, while some prefer cleaning the stalls. Each individual has the opportunity to participate in activities they love, fostering personal growth and fulfillment.

One of the special riders from No Limits is Michael, who has been a student there for 8 years. When the partnership began, Michael initially enjoyed grooming and petting the horses at Tara's Chance. He would confidently lead the miniature horses around the ranch to ensure they got their exercise. Over time, our goal was to help Michael overcome his initial hesitation towards the size and power of horses, gradually building his confidence.

To prepare him for riding, we spent several weeks patiently standing on the mounting blocks, gradually familiarizing Michael with the process. This incremental approach was crucial for Michael, as building comfort and confidence on the blocks marked a significant achievement in his journey.

After patiently waiting and gaining confidence over four months, Michael finally took the leap and mounted Sierra for the first time. As he circled the arena, we could see his initial nerves fade away and turn into a sense of calmness and joy. Michael's anxiety transformed into excitement and his pride shined through his smile. It was an incredible moment celebrated enthusiastically by his peers from No Limits. After he dismounted, he told me, "I am going to ride Sierra next time and the next time and the next time."





Michael's journey is just one example of the transformative impact witnessed at Tara's Chance through our collaboration with No Limits. Each week, we witness remarkable progress as these young adults with special needs surpass expectations, grow more confident, and thrive in their own unique ways.









Rider Spotlight - Jaxson

Jaxson was diagnosed with autism spectrum when he was 2 and he is currently 8-years-old. As parents of Jaxson, we have given him different types of therapies such as: Applied Behavior Analyst (ABA), Occupational Therapy (OT), Speech and other therapies to help with his sensory needs.





After trying all the conventional therapies, we were in a situation where the therapies were not working anymore. We started to look for alternatives to increase social skills, language and provide sensory input.

Initially, we did find a horse therapy group session but they did not have accommodations for Jaxson's sensory needs as he is only able to wear shorts and requirements were to wear pants. Jaxson was unable to connect with the staff nor the horse. This led us to try another therapy and by luck we found Tara's Chance. After waiting for almost a year and a half we were so thrilled when we received the call from Tara's Chance. Our first meeting with their staff was fantastic, the venue was amazing, and right away we felt like home.

We had our initial meeting and he passed the test and we were super excited. He seemed really happy and natural at the initial consultation but in the first class everything changed. His behaviors started to show after that.

Cindy and Jaxson connected right away so her patience and dedication to Jaxson have been key to his success. Cindy created a strategy that the parents were going to stay away during his session so she could have full control of class and most importantly, his trust.

Our initial challenge was picking him up from school and driving to the venue. He would cry stating "No horse class, no horse class!" After getting to the venue some of the challenges were not wanting to get out of the car, not wanting to wear a helmet or dropping on the floor and not wanting to get up for the session.

Another difficult task was to get him on the horse, but with dedication, patience and experience Cindy and staff were able to persuade Jaxson to get on the horse. This was a key factor of not giving up on Jaxson and giving us hope as a family. Little by little we were making progress, we started to provide snacks during our car ride, and created a visual schedule and reward system for completion of courses. At the end of each session, Cindy would provide feedback and strategize what was the best option for all of us and to move forward.

We started to see an increase of time that Jaxson was on the horse and less negative behavior. Cindy and staff started to connect with Jaxson with preferable items such as ABC letters and applying them into horse therapy sessions which was a total success.

What can we say about the horse? If I could describe it with one word, I could say that the horse knows Jaxson more than us as parents. The horse is very calm and around all the chaos with Jaxson, was able to connect... which makes it emotional even writing this.

Currently, we are happy to say that the behaviors have significantly decreased driving to the horse class session. He is not trying to get away from the entrance, he is able to wear his helmet, and we started to watch him from the benches with no negative behavior. He looks relaxed and happy on the horse. His speech has increased, and he is more balanced with his sensory needs.



Autism is a journey where you do not know what you are going to get day by day, but the most important is not giving up even if it feels you are not moving forward.

This organization has changed Jaxson and our lives and we want to thank Cindy, the staff that truly changes people's lives and are genuinely great people who care.




